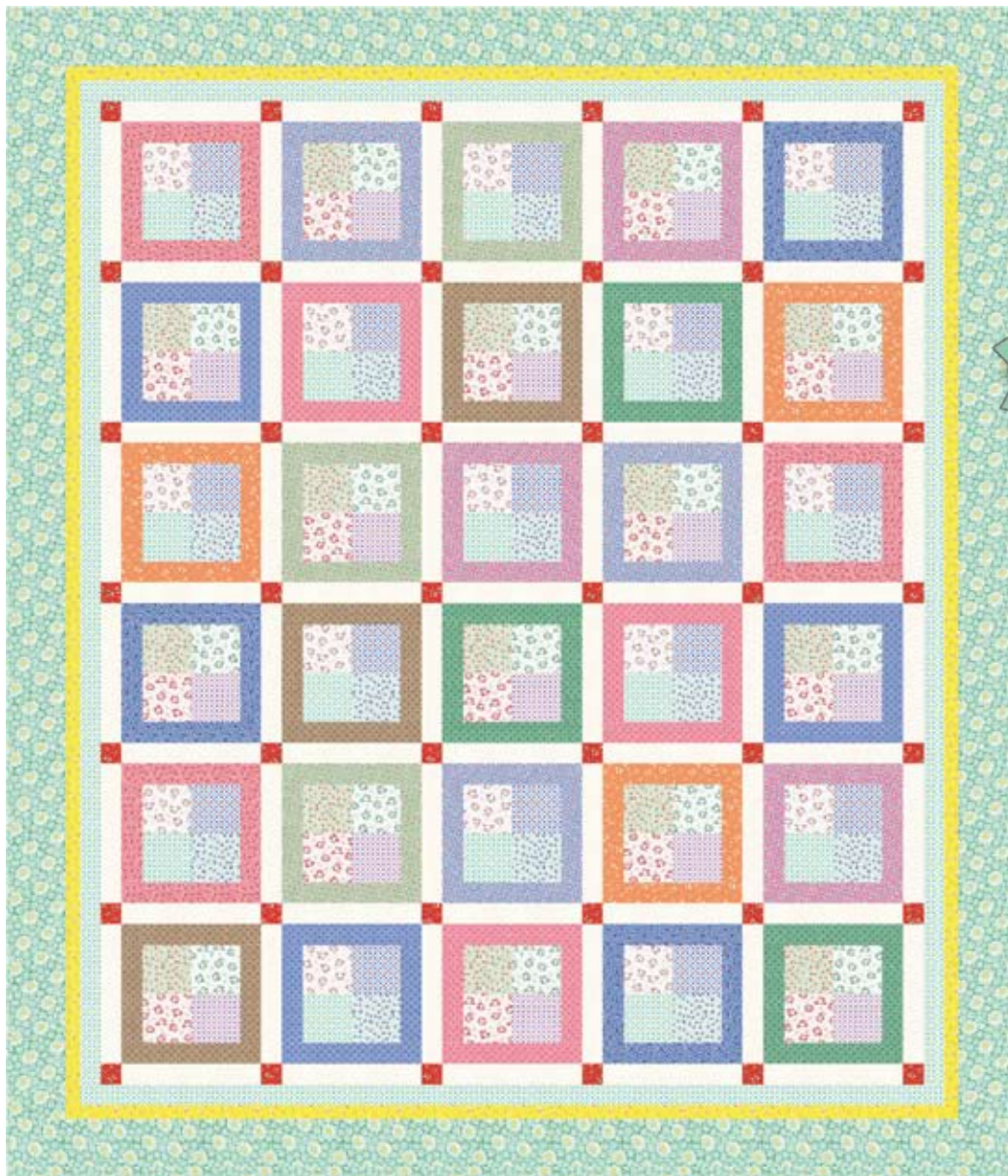

Quilt size: 72" x 83½"

Yardages

Blocks

- 1 fat quarter *each of*:
GTRE 349C, GTRE 349P, GTRE 349T, GTRE 351C,
GTRE 351C, GTRE 352B, GTRE 352C, GTRE 347B,
GTRE 347G, GTRE 347P, GTRE 348O, GTRE 350B,
GTRE 350P, GTRE 353B, GTRE 353G, GTRE 353P,
and GTRE 353Z

Blocks and inner border

- ¾ yard of GTRE 352G

Sashing

- 1⅜ yards of CSNE 01 N (cream solid)
- 1 fat quarter of GTRE 348R

Middle border

- ⅔ yard of GTRE 348Y

Outer border and binding

- 1¾ yards of GTRE 346G

Backing

- 5¼ yards of any GTRE fabric

Granny's Treasure Box

Quilt by Nancy Mahoney using her *Granny's Treasures* fabric collection from P&B Textiles

Quilt size: 72" x 83½" ♦ Block size: 10"

Cutting

From each fat quarter of 349C, 349P, 349T, 351C, 351C, 352B, and 352C, cut:

- (15) 4" squares (105 total)

From GTRE 353G, cut:

- (7) 2" x 42" inner-border strips
- (15) 4" squares

From each fat quarter of 347B, 347G, 347P, 348O, 350B, 350P, 353B, 353G, 353P, and 353Z, cut:

- (6) 2" x 21" strips; crosscut *each* strip into (1) 2" x 10½" rectangle and (1) 2" x 7½" rectangle (you should have 6 rectangles, 10½" long, and 6 rectangles, 7½" long from each fabric; 60 total of each rectangle)

From the cream solid, cut:

- (4) 10½" strips; crosscut into (71) 2" x 10½" sashing strips

From 348R, cut:

- (5) 2" x 21" strips, crosscut into (42) 2" squares

From 348Y, cut:

- (7) 1½" x 42" middle-border strips

From 346G, cut:

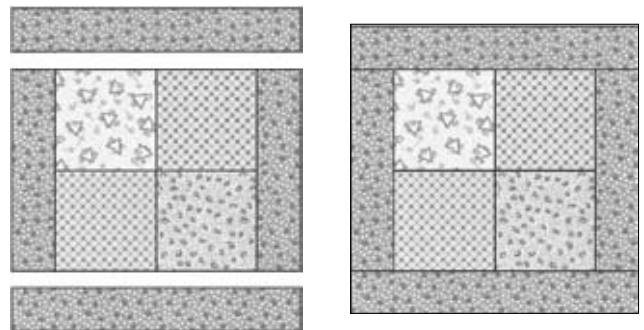
- (8) 4½" outer-border strips
- (8) 2¼" binding strips

Making the Blocks

1. Referring to the photo, lay out four 4" squares in a random four-patch arrangement. Sew the squares together in pairs and then sew the pairs together to make a four-patch unit. Make 30 four-patch units.
2. Sew 2" x 7½" rectangles to opposite sides of each four-patch unit. Press the seam allowances toward the rectangles.
3. Sew 2" x 10½" rectangles to the top and bottom of each unit from step 2 to complete a block. Press the seam allowances toward the rectangles. Make 30 blocks each measuring 10½" square.

Assembling the Quilt Top

4. Alternately sew together five blocks and six cream sashing strips to make a block row. Press the seam allowances toward the sashing strips. Make six block rows.
5. Alternately sew together five cream sashing strips and six 348R (red) squares to make a horizontal sashing row. Press the seam allowances toward the sashing strips. Make seven sashing rows.
6. Sew together the block rows and sashing rows, alternating them as shown below; press.
7. Sew together the 2"-wide inner-border strips end to end. Measure the length of the quilt top. Cut two strips to this length and sew them to the sides of the quilt top. Measure the width of the quilt top, including the just-added borders. Cut two strips to this length and sew them to the top and bottom of the quilt top. Press all seam allowances toward the borders.
8. In the same manner, sew together the 1½"-wide middle-border strips end to end. Measure, cut, and sew the strips to the quilt top.
9. Sew together the 4½"-wide outer-border strips end to end. Measure, cut, and sew the strips to the quilt top.
10. Layer the quilt top with batting and backing; baste. Quilt as desired. Sew the 2¼" binding strips together end to end and bind the edges to finish.
